



PACKING CHECKLIST

- Identification
- One suitcase with luggage tag
- One carry-on bag (backpack)
- Waterproof jacket
- Two pairs comfortable shoes
- Water Shoes: for some swimming and hiking, you will need shoes you can walk in the water with, like Teva sandals or similar water shoes
- Hat
- Pants and shorts – waterproof if possible
- Shirts, sweatshirts for layering
- Underwear and socks
- Flashlight
- Camera and film
- Good water bottles: at least 64 ounces (you may purchase the Grand Classroom Nalgene bottles at our website or call us)
- Sunscreen/lipscreen
- Ziplock bags
- Sundry items/medication
- Portable snacks

OPTIONAL

- Spending money for souvenirs
- Calling card
- Postcard stamps

NOTE: for the kayaking portion of your trip you will be given a stuff sack, on the first night, to pack for that part of the trip. You will have a place to store your luggage until you return to the bus three days later. You will need to bring only essentials such as clothes for rowing, hiking and sleeping in, toiletries, sunscreen, a few snacks and not much else. More details will come before the trip, but all equipment will be carried by motor boat and you will only need to carry your day pack and WATER!

PACKING LIST



LUGGAGE AND ID

Each student should bring two bags:

1 – SUITCASE

Each participant should bring one regular sized suitcase which will be checked at the airport. Airport regulations state that all bags must be tagged on the outside with the actual traveler's name and address. Do not attempt to bring weapons of any kind on the airplane as per FAA regulations.

2 – CARRY-ON

You should also pack a carry-on which should ideally be your backpack. This will be used on the airplane, as well as a travel bag for touring days. You will use it to carry your camera, extra clothes, gloves, water and snacks. It's also a good idea to pack personal items in the bag (such as medication, money, contact lenses or glasses) along with a change of clothing in case of luggage delays. Affix a luggage tag with the traveler's name and address on the outside.

3 - IDENTIFICATION

All participants must have ID with them as outlined:

18 and older: photo ID such as driver's license

17 and under: non-photo ID such as birth certificate, library card, student ID or social security card

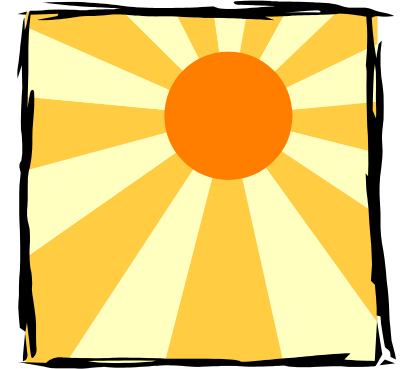
CLOTHING

- HAT – To keep sun off head
- JACKET – waterproof preferably with a hood
- PANTS - waterproof pants and shorts
- BATHING SUIT
- SHOES – tennis shoes or hiking boots suitable for walking. Please bring two pairs.
- SOCKS and UNDERWEAR
- SHIRTS AND SWEATSHIRTS suitable for layering

OTHER ITEMS

- SUNSCREEN – body and facial sunscreen as well as lipscreen with maximum SPF
- CAMERA and FILM – Stock up at home, it will be much more expensive at the National Park. Checked baggage screening will damage undeveloped film on the way home – please carry on.
- WATER BOTTLE – Minimum 64 ounces! Make sure it has a good seal so it does not leak in your backpack
- ZIPLOCK BAGS – to keep camera and film dry in the event of rain
- SNACKS – All meals are included, but you may want to bring granola bars, power bars or other portable, sealed snacks.
- SUNDRIES – toiletries of your choice
- FLASHLIGHT

WEATHER

The weather in Northern Arizona in July is normally a high of 80 and low in the 40's at the rim, with temperatures closer to the 90's (or higher) and 60's at night down in the canyon. Of course, be prepared for storms, which can be cold, as well as very, very hot weather.

Portions of the hike will exceed temperatures of 100 degrees – you must be prepared with a hat, sunscreen and water bottles.

This is an outdoor adventure, so remember to think PRACTICAL over fashionable.

We suggest that you check the weather online at www.intellicast.com in the days leading up to the trip. The code to type in for Grand Canyon weather is GCN.
